- A. Livestock exhibitors are required to comply with all of the statutory and regulatory provisions of the State of Wisconsin relating to animal health. Please see the current animal health regulations as posted on our website: www.racinecountyfair.com
- B. For base dates and class definitions please see Section ATCP 160.08 of the State of Wisconsin Regulations posted on the website: <u>www.racinecountyfair.com</u>.
- C. All exhibitors, please see the Livestock Show and Sale Regulations located on the Fair website at <u>www.racinecountyfair.com</u>.
- D. Any exhibitor that has been banned from another approved fair / show is ineligible to exhibit at the Racine County Fair.
- E. Cock, Hen, Old Duck, Old Drake, Old Goose, and Old Gander **must** have been hatched prior to January 1 of the current year.
- F. Cockerel, Pullet, Young Duck, and Young Goose **must** have been hatched on or after January 1 of the current year.
- G. All entries must be in place between the hours of 2:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday of Fair. Animals may not leave until the approved release time on Sunday which starts at 7:00 p.m. (walkup only) and at 9:00 p.m. by vehicle.
- H. Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) certification is required for all Youth Poultry exhibitors at the Racine County Fair. Contact the Racine County UW-Extension office or https://yqcaprogram.org/ for more information.
- I. Fair management reserves the right to have an approved veterinarian examine any fowl and to exclude any fowl at any time for any cause. Any exhibit excluded will be returned to the owner or slaughtered at the opinion of the attending veterinarian.
- J. All Poultry over 4 months of age or that have reached sexual maturity shall be accompanied by documentation of a negative test for Pullorum-Typhoid conducted within 90 days of arrival at the exhibition or originate from a flock designated as U.S. Pullorum-Typhoid clean.
- K. All fowl exhibited may be subject to quarantine and slaughtered if any infectious or contagious disease is discovered among any of the fowl in the exhibit.
- L. If any bird is found to have any type of parasite (lice, mite, etc.), they must be removed from the Fairground and taken home. Birds will be checked before being caged.
- M. It is advisable that a duplicate entry sheet be made and accompany the birds upon arrival at the Fair.
- N. It is recommended that all birds have a number leg band for identification.
- O. Each exhibitor is allowed one entry per premium number, with a maximum of two (2) entries in the turkey division. A single utility chicken (cockerel or pullet) can be shown from their same sex (broiler or roaster) meat pen. Each exhibitor is allowed a maximum total of SIXTEEN (16) entries (not including eggs or showmanship) entered in the Junior Fair Poultry Department.
- P. Exhibitors **must** be 9 years of age as of January 1 of the current year or in 3rd grade of the current year to show Poultry.
- Q. Judging of Showmanship will be from 9:00 a.m. to Noon and 1:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday of Fair. Exhibitors must be signed up by 4:00 p.m. to participate. NO exhibitors are allowed to participate in Showmanship if they have not officially signed up through the Fair Entry Office.
- R. Judging of Poultry Breed Classes will begin at 8:30 a.m. on Wednesday of Fair. Breed Classes include: Chickens, Bantams, Ducks, Geese, Hybrid Egg Type and Eggs.
- S. Judging of Poultry Market Classes will begin at 8:30 a.m. on Friday of Fair. Market Classes include: Turkeys, Hybrid Meat Type, Broilers, and Roasters. Eggs will be judged on Friday after judging of Market Classes.
- T. Exhibitors must furnish feed and take care of their own poultry.
- U. All exhibitors are responsible for keeping their exhibits clean and orderly at all times. Clean cages are mandatory for the duration of the Fair. Shavings will be provided to the exhibitor. Each

exhibitor will be charged \$3.00 at checkout when making their Fair entries to offset the cost of shavings.

- V. All Junior Fair exhibitors must fulfill barn duty requirements.
- W. Exhibitors: 4-H and FFA must attend at least one (1) County Wide Poultry Meeting. If at least one (1) meeting is not attended, the exhibitor's poultry entries will be dropped one (1) placing. Only college students participating in the Poultry Project may count the pre-fair poultry barn set up as a meeting.
- X. Danish Judging System will be used for all classes.
- Y. The Poultry show is judged by APA (American Poultry Association) and ABA (American Bantam Association) standards.

- A. Photos must be of domestic poultry only which include: ducks, geese, turkeys, pigeons, chickens, and guineas. No photos of wild poultry, birds, or games will be considered.
- B. Entries must be 8" x 10" and mounted on heavy, stiff background, cut to 11" x 14". Only one entry per exhibitor. First place exhibitors will not be eligible to win first place for two consecutive years. Exhibitors are eligible to win the Grand Prize a maximum of TWO (2) times.
- C. Punch two holes (minimum 1/4" in diameter) at the top of the mounting board exactly 9" apart. Attach your name and club on the back of the mounting board. The grand prize winner will also need their .JPEG file.
- D. Entry deadline is Tuesday of Fair Week during bird check-in at 9:00 p.m. Judging will begin at 10:00 am on Wednesday of fair.
- E. Photos will be judged on **quality**, **clarity**, **and composition**. The bird must be the main subject. Consideration will also be given to the quality of the subject being photographed. (i.e., is the bird clean, in condition, etc.) Since the winning photo will be on permanent display in the Poultry barn, it should be a good representation of the breed.
- F. Entries taken by a person that are similar or nearly identical to that person's winning photo the previous year will not be considered. Please avoid the same / similar bird in the same / similar background.
- G. The Grand Prize winning photograph will become property of the Racine County Fair and will be reproduced to be hung in the Poultry Barn.
- H. No entry fee is required.
- I. All eligible entries will be privately judged and displayed in the Poultry Barn during the Racine

County Fair.

ROOSTER CROWING CONTEST

- A. The rooster crowing contest will be held on Thursday of Fair at 8:30 a.m.
- B. Roosters have a 15-minute period to do the most crowing.
- C. The contest is open to any current Junior Fair poultry exhibitor.
- D. The bird must be owned and handled by the exhibitor but does not have to be entered in this year's exhibit.
- E. All roosters 4 months of age shall be accompanied by documentation of a negative test for Pullorum-Typhoid conducted within 90 days prior to arrival at the fair to originate from a flock designated as US Pullorum-Typhoid Clean.
- F. Birds of any age are eligible. Only one (1) bird per exhibitor.
- G. No entry fee will be required.
- H. The exhibitor must be present at the contest.
- I. Registration for the Rooster Crowing contest must be completed by 6:00 p.m. on Wednesday of Fair with the Superintendent(s).

Hints for Better Crowing

A rooster cannot be made to crow, however, he can be encouraged!

Caging him several days before the contest and moving him in strange surroundings is a good training program. Flighty or hard to manage birds seldom crow. Keep the cage covered or dark and remove the covering just before the contest begins. He is then fooled into believing morning has just arrived. Contestants may use any method, without touching the bird, to get their entry to crow.

BREEDER – EXHIBITOR RECOGNITION

Any exhibitor who owns and breeds his / her own birds will be recognized on Wednesday of Fair. As a breeder of Purebred Exhibition Poultry, exhibitor will receive an insignia recognizing their efforts.

POULTRY MEAT SALE

- A. To be eligible for the meat sale the exhibitor must fulfill their barn duty responsibilities.
- B. Birds to be auctions will be selected from the "meat" classes including:
 - a. Chickens Utility Type (Division 2)
 - b. Ducks Any Heavy or Medium Duck
 - c. Geese Any Heavy or Medium Goose
 - d. Turkey Any Turkey
- C. Any Junior Fair exhibitor having Market class birds may select one blue ribbon winning bird to sell at the auction. If the exhibitor was not awarded a blue, the exhibitor may sell their next highest placing bird. No fourth placed ribbon bird will be allowed to be sold in the Poultry Auction.
- D. Junior Fair exhibitors are responsible for the processing of their auctioned bird(s) and for the delivery of the finished product to the buyer within 14 days of the conclusion of the Fair.
- E. A percentage (which will coincide with the large animal sale) will be deducted from each bird sold for improvements to the Poultry Project.

- F. All birds selected for the meat auction shall be properly finished and of marketable quality. The Poultry Superintendent(s) and Committee reserve the right to reject any birds found unsuitable for the sale.
- G. Sign-up and banding for the Sale will start when Turkey division judging is complete and will end at 3 p.m. on Friday in the Poultry Barn.
- H. In order to sell a bird in the Poultry Meat Sale, the exhibitor MUST fill out a "Market Animal Drug History Sheet" which must be signed by the exhibitor and parent or guardian. This sheet must be turned in to the Poultry Superintendent(s) at auction sign-up.
- I. NO BIRDS hatched prior to January 1st will be allowed to be sold in auction.
- J. If the seller is not present at the time their sale number is called, they WILL NOT be able to sell in the auction. Additions to the bottom of the sale will not be allowed.
