- A. Livestock exhibitors are required to comply with all of the statutory and regulatory provisions of the State of Wisconsin relating to animal health. Please see the current animal health regulations as posted on our website: www.racinecountyfair.com
- B. For base dates and class definitions please see Section ATCP 160.08 of the State of Wisconsin Regulations posted on the website: www.racinecountyfair.com.
- C. All exhibitors, please see the Livestock Show and Sale Regulations located on the Fair website at www.racinecountyfair.com.
- D. Junior Fair exhibitors may exhibit in Open Class, paying the appropriate fees, but must abide by the Open Class rules and will compete for ribbons only.
- E. Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) certification is required for all Youth Goat Exhibitors at the Racine County Fair. Contact the Racine County UW-Extension office or https://yqcaprogram.org/ for more information.
- F. Animals shown in both Junior and Open Class may only receive premiums in Junior Class.
- G. All animals competing must be in place, in the pens, no later than 9:00 p.m. on Tuesday of Fair. Goats may not leave until the approved release time on Sunday.
- H. Judging will be held on Friday of Fair Week starting at 9:00 a.m.
- I. All animals must be owned by the exhibitor at the time of entry.
- J. All goats must be permanently tattooed, ear tagged, or micro-chipped for identification.
- K. Market wethers meeting the minimum weight of 50 pounds are eligible for the Livestock Sale. Market wether weigh-in time and location will be announced.
- L. Market wethers are required to be identified with a Flock ID and DNA/RFID tag. Market animals must abide by the rules set forth by the Livestock Show and Sale Committee.
- M. Market wethers must be wethered prior to entry.
- N. All Junior Class exhibitors MUST participate in at least one Showmanship Class in Division 3. No goat may be shown more than once in the Showmanship Division.
- O. Pens will be assigned.
- P. No equipment, milk stands, or fans may be in the aisles. No electrical cords may be placed across the aisles.
- Q. Animal(s) may be dismissed from the show ring at the judge's discretion. Premiums may not be awarded when an entry is not worthy, even though there may be no competition. Judges shall be so instructed.
- R. All goats being shown in a group class must be shown in their individual class.
- S. Danish Judging System will be used for all classes.

PHOTOGRAPHY CONTEST

- A. Photos must be of only a Goat
- B. Entries must be 8" x 10" and mounted on heavy, stiff background, cut to 11" x 14". Only one entry per exhibitor. First place exhibitors will not be eligible to win first place for two consecutive years.
- C. Punch 2 (two) holes (minimum 1/4" in diameter) at the top of the mounting board exactly 9" apart. Attach your name and club on the back of the mounting board. The Grand Prize winner will also need their .JPEG file.
- D. Entry deadline is Tuesday of Fair Week during goat check-in until 8:00 p.m. Judging will be done on

- Wednesday morning of the Fair.
- E. Photos will be judged on quality, clarity, and composition. Goat(s) must be the main subject.
- F. Entries taken by a person that are similar or nearly identical to that person's winning photo the previous year will not be considered. Please avoid the same / similar Goat in the same / similar background.
- G. The Grand Prize-winning photograph will become the property of the Racine County Agricultural Society, Inc. and will be reproduced to be hung in the Goat Barn.
- H. No entry fee is required
- All eligible entries will be privately judged and displayed in the Goat Barn during the Racine County Fair.
